***The presentation is a compulsory requirement for completion and ABD*, so D4 students must present their theses.**

Note for the Graduate School Thesis Defense Meeting (*kenkyu happyokai*)

The Thesis Defense Meeting will be held in accordance with the “Guidelines on the Procedures of Graduate School Thesis Defense Meeting”. Students who wish to present their theses should submit the application form and the relevant documents to the Student Affairs Division by the due date indicated below.

Dates: June 16, 18 and 19, 2026 (The program will be released in early or mid-May.)

Deadline for application submission: noon on Friday, April 3

Venues: Meeting Room 1, Room 2 (1F of Medical Research Building)

Presenters:(1) The 4th-year and 3rd-year students in the doctoral program who are scheduled to completion or ABD during the 2026 academic year.

(2) Those who had been enrolled in a doctoral program for at least four years (excluding periods of leave of absence) and had ABD, apply for a doctoral degree within seven years of the total number of years of enrolment (excluding periods of leave of absence).

Notes: (1) **Presenting a thesis at the Thesis Defense Meeting (*kenkyu happyokai*) is a prerequisite for ABD and graduating with PhD.**

(2) You cannot designate the date that you are presenting your thesis. If each day is unavailable, do not apply for this Thesis Defense Meeting.

(3) Please consult your academic advisor about candidate reviewers for your doctoral thesis defense.

*ABD "All but dissertation" means a status of a doctoral student who has met all program requirements except for writing thesis and the final defense at the end of a PhD program. In short, they finish their program without a PhD degree.

How to Deal with Patents and Other Intellectual Property Rights at the Graduate School Thesis Defense Meeting
(*kenkyu happyokai*)

In principle, when presenting intellectual property at a scientific meeting or in a scientific journal, the following provisions are applied in general.

[Basic provisions]

Make sure to submit a patent application before presenting intellectual property at a scientific meeting or in a scientific journal. If it is impossible to submit a patent application before the presentation, you do not have to disclose the details of your intellectual property at the Thesis Defense Meeting. You may also choose the following options.

- ① If your intellectual property is open to the public, you cannot apply for a patent in Europe any more.
- ② If the publication or presentation is not under the auspices of an academic body designated by the Patent Office, you will not be eligible to receive redress (application of exception to loss of novelty)
* Nagoya University is an academic body designated by the Patent Office, so it is therefore possible to submit a patent application within 6 months of the presentation.
- ③ Even if redress (application of exception to loss of novelty) is received, if a third party submits a patent application with the same content as that of your publication or presentation, you will no longer be eligible to exert their rights to the submitted patent.

Your presentation includes intellectual property that you are going to apply for a patent, please consult the Intellectual Property Section (744-2066) in advance.

*** If you do not give a presentation, you will not be able to complete or ABD, but you will be retained and will have to pay tuition fees.**

*** If you do not apply for a degree after the Defense Meeting, you will be ABD after a total of four years of study (excluding periods of absence).**

*If you wish to prematurely complete the doctoral course, you must present your thesis at the Thesis Defense Meeting in advance. Please contact the Student Affairs Division.

Guidelines on the Implementation of the 68th Graduate School Thesis Defense Meeting (*kenkyu happyokai*)

1. Purpose

The meeting constitutes a preliminary examination for a doctoral degree, and as such its purpose is to encourage the participation of young researchers as well as professors, to provide an opportunity for extensive discussion on the doctoral researches, and to contribute to invigorate research activities in Nagoya University, as well as to enhance education of the graduate students.

2. Dates: June 16, 18 and 19, 2026

Time: 8:00 AM to 9:00 PM

Venues: Meeting Room 1, Room 2 (1F of Basic Medical Research Building)

3. Presenters

- (1) The 4th-year and 3rd-year students in the doctoral program who are scheduled to completion or ABD during the 2026 academic year.
- (2) Those who have been enrolled in a doctoral program for at least four years (excluding periods of leave of absence) and who, having ABD, apply for a doctoral degree within seven years of the total number of years of enrolment (excluding periods of leave of absence).

Abstracts for Graduate School Thesis Defense Meeting (<i>kenkyu happyokai</i>)	Electronic file Word file (.docx)	Make an abstract using a template in around 800 characters in Japanese or 200 words in English.

*After application, we will send bulk email to your THERS email address for notifications. If you have another e-mail address that you use mainly, please set up for e-mail transferring.

5. Audience at the meeting

- (1) Faculty with the rank of assistant professor and above who are officially responsible for graduate school teaching
- (2) Graduate students

6. Procedures

- (1) The Committee for Education of the Graduate School will organize the program for the Graduate School Thesis Defense Meeting (*kenkyu happyokai*).
- (2) An abstract book will be sent to each presenting student and faculty members in advance.
- (3) The Committee for Education will finalize the members of the Doctoral Committee of each presenter.
- (4) Each presentation should be 15 minutes, which is followed by a Q&A defense session for 15 minutes. A total of 30 minutes is allotted to each presenter. Questions from the attending audience will be taken before questions by reviewers. If an academic advisor explains the research background and the research outline, this shall also be added to the 30-min defense meeting.
- (5) The reviewers will give one of acceptable S, A, B, and C grades or re-examination or an unacceptable D grade to each student.
