I am very pleased to announce that the *Nagoya Journal of Medical Science* is celebrating its 100th anniversary. The journal's first issue was launched in 1923 as the *Aich Journal of Experimental Medicine*. Since its establishment, the *Nagoya Journal of Medical Science* has published numerous original papers and review articles; it has played a pivotal role in the advancement of novel medicine and medical science.

The Nagoya University was established approximately 150 years ago, ie, 50 years before the journal was launched. The Nagoya Prefecture established a temporary medical school and public hospital in 1871, which is considered to be the founding year of the Nagoya University (Table 1). The school's name has changed several times, but it was renamed Nagoya University in 1949 under the new education system. Today, as one of the most prestigious universities in Japan, Nagoya University has produced six Nobel laureates. The School of Medicine and Graduate School of Medicine form the core of Nagoya University.

1939	Established as Nagoya Imperial University along with the School of Medicine and the School of Science and Engineering
1949	Renamed Nagoya University under the new education system
2018	Designated as one of the country's core "comprehensive" universities
